Rights of Nations

This issue of the journal is related to the contemporary topical issue of the rights of peoples in the era of cultural interaction. The assembly and editing of texts related to the aforementioned issues was undertaken by Professor of the Jagiellonian University, Leszek Korporowicz, PhD, a long-time collaborator of the Jesuit University Ignatianum in Cracow, including in the *Social Dictionaries* project, where, together with Dr. Łukasz Burkiewicz and Dr. Agnieszka Knap-Stefaniuk, he became co-editor of the *Studia kulturowe* collection (Krakow 2022). The leading issue in this journal will be presented in an introduction prepared by Prof. Korporowicz. I would like to mention that in this section there are seventeen texts written by authors from various scientific centers in Poland.

In the regular Religion and the Media section, Katarzyna Daraż-Duda (Jesuit University Ignatianum in Krakow) presents the topic of the use of YouTube in the work of evangelization by the Dominicans of the St. Dominic Roman Catholic Parish in Szczecin in 2020.

Two articles are delivered by our Management and Marketing section. The first one, by Wojciech Jarecki and Marek Kunasz (University of Szczecin), deals with the mismatch of competencies in organizations of varying size. The following article is a collective work by Krzysztof Krukowski (Universty of Warmia and Mazury in Olsztyn), Maciej Zastempowski (Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń), Artur J. Kożuch (Military University of Technology) and Monika Wakuła (Siedlce University of Natural Sciences and Humanities) and is related to the multidimensional attitudes toward organizational change of employees of public organizations.

The Varia section contains two articles. Krzysztof Bochenek and Jarosław Kinal (University of Rzeszów) addressed the issue related to the devaluation of religious and ethical consciousness in the postmodern era. Adam Żaliński (Jagiellonian University) described the revitalization activities in the space of Lemkivshchyna on the example of the bell tower in Polany Surowiczne. The issue concludes with a review of the book Rok 1920. Dzienniki Stanisławy Serafińskiej spisane na Koryznówce w Wiśniczu (Dzienniki Rok 1920 Stanisława Serafińska) by Anna Pachowicz (University of Applied Sciences in Tarnów).

We hope you will find this issue interesting. We wish you a pleasant and useful reading.
